Becoming a Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator offers the opportunity to make friends, get to know your neighbours and to make a difference to your community by encouraging everyone to work together as a team.

You would act as a principal point of contact for the police, where necessary, and take an overall view as to the anticipation of and prevention of crime, collate local issues and attend Neighbourhood Watch meetings when possible.

You would promote Neighbourhood Watch by way of publicity, and with Town Council and police liaison.

This is an interesting and stimulating role and much satisfaction can be gained from seeing a community working together. It has been proved that this does keep crime levels down.

Neighbourhood Watch Coordinators should be great communicators, friendly and approachable, and above all interested in reducing crime and trying to improve the community in which they live.

Coordinators offer as much time to their community as they would like and are able to. There isn't any expected requirement.

Under normal circumstances - Whittlesey & District Neighbourhood Watch is about local people working together to create safer, attractive, and friendly places to live, places where crime is less likely to happen and people are less likely to turn to anti-social behaviour. Groups often join forces not just with the police, but with many other organisations to make their neighbourhoods more secure and pleasant. Being part of a group also makes it much easier to get funding and support for the kinds of things your neighbourhood needs.
