

A47 Guyhirn junction Roadworks bulletin January 2022

Progress on our A47 Guyhirn junction scheme

We continue to deliver improvements to the A47 junction and increase the size of the roundabout at Guyhirn, which once complete, will ease congestion and cope with increasing traffic levels.

What's next

The next stage of work includes resurfacing and repairing the existing road surface.

- The A141 March Road will be closed from the Guyhirn roundabout south to the A605 from Friday 14 to Monday 17 January and Friday 21 to Monday 24 January, between the hours of 8pm and 6am.
- Diversion route: Northbound traffic will take the A605 westbound through Whittlesey towards Peterborough, then take the A1139 and the A15 north to pass Peterborough, and then the A47 eastbound through Thorney to reach the Guyhirn roundabout.

Southbound traffic will follow this diversion route in reverse. (**Diagram 1**)

While we try to minimise any disruption and noise from our works, there may be some unavoidable noise such as reversing bleepers on vehicles. Any resident whose access has been impacted has been contacted to inform them how to get to their property.

Other work nearby

The following work is also taking place nearby on the A47:

- Structural works at Longthorpe until Tuesday 14 June, with road closures.
- Inspections and surveys between Wansford and Sutton until Saturday 26 February, with temporary traffic lights.
- Junction improvement works at The Causeway and the junction with Pode Hole Quarry entrance until Friday 4 March, with temporary traffic lights.
